Aseem Aggarwal, member of Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, said: "Once GST comes into effect, all central and all goods and services will be subsumed within an integrated tax, having two components: a central GST and a state GST. This will ensure a complete, comprehensive and continuous mechanism of tax credits. Under it, there will be tax only on value addition at each stage, with the producer seller at every stage able to set off his taxes against GST paid on purchases.

President of the association Jagdish Raisaid, "The end consumer will bear only the GST charged by the last dealer in the supply chain, with set-off benefits at all the previous stages."

He also discussed the impact of GST on the industry of freight forwarders and clearing house agents and also the proactive measures to be taken by them.

tubhiana: As July 1, the deadline for Goods and Services Tax (GST) rollout is approaching, tax experts have started organising seminars in the city to generate the awareness on GST among the industrialists and traders.

On Saturday evening, Punjab Association of Computer Traders (PACT) and Association of Computer Entrepreneurs (ACE) organised a seminar on GST awareness at a city hotel.

Meanwhile, Thaman Associates organised a practical session at SCD Government College on Sunday. The seminar aimed at making the traders aware about the concept of GST and how to plan their business going forward. The industrialists and businessman from in and around the district attended the seminar.

sion that included the issues regarding stock in hand and its treatment after the implementation of GST. He highlighted the compliances and processes required to carry forward the credits. Aggarwal also focused on the newly passed credit transfer document (CTD) rules and the transition rules.

In a session held on Sunday, NK Thaman an advocate and consultant gave the presentation on the key features and the substantive provisions of GST. He explained the taxable events for GST, interstate and intrastate supply when the liability to pay GST arises, the value on which GST is payable, payment of GST and anti-profiteering measures. He highlighted the problems that will be faced in case of jobwork, as assessees have to bear the burden of GST at 18% in case he gets any process undertaken from a jobworker.

In the second half of the workshop, PK Thaman elaborated on the procedural provisions of GST, like issuance of tax invoice, credit and debit notes, receipt and refund vouchers, payment vouchers and delivery challan, electronic way bill, maintenance of records under GST, filling of different returns such as returns for outward supplies, returns for inward supplies, final monthly returns and annual returns.

During the both the seminars, the audience participated in the interactive sessions with the experts and got their queries solved.
